## Complete Streets: Plan, Policy & Performance

Complete streets are mostly known as a philosophy that considers all transportation modes equally in the planning and design of transportation networks. Complete streets are intended to improve transportation choice but can also improve community factors like public health, safety, energy conservation, air quality, land values, economic vitality, livable neighborhoods, civic space and human interaction, and access to jobs, goods and services. This multi-agency panel takes participants through the experiences and programs of locations within and outside the Missouri APWA area, and provides examples of how to instill complete streets in a plan, create adoptable policies that encourage long-term implementation, and understand factors to measure performance for complete street applications.
